One of the priorities of the Guggenheim Museum Bilbao is to create an inclusive environment to make sure that all visitors have access to all Museum services and activities. We therefore offer you this information guide, which complements our catalogue of general information. Please send us any remarks or suggestions you may have.



GUGGENHEIM BILBAO



- **Audio guides:** This system allows visitors to enjoy a tour of the Museum, listening to information on the architecture of the building and exhibitions. Adjustable headphones are available on request. We have an induction loop system. Audio guide nr. 100 allows kids to discover *The Matter of Time*. Accessible content on the building and some of the works around it is available for people with intellectual disability.

- **Video guides in Spanish sign-language**, with or without subtitles, for the hearing impaired. Printed transcripts of audio guides are also available in Basque, Spanish, English, French, German, and Italian.



- Visually impaired visitors are given the opportunity to discover the **Museum building and the sculptures** *Tulips*, *Puppy*, *Maman* and *Tall Tree and the Eye* thanks to **tactile models**.

- **Strollers and baby-carriers:** If you would like to borrow a baby stroller or carrier, ask at our coatroom.



- **Wheelchairs:** Wheelchairs are available for the comfort of visitors who need them. Ask at our coatroom.

- **Portable chairs:** Ultra-light chairs to take a rest at any point on your tour. Ask at our coatroom.



- **Restrooms:** All restrooms have individual wheelchair accessible toilets. There are also baby-changing facilities on floors 1 and 0.



- **Elevators:** All elevators are large enough to provide convenient service between floors.



- **Store/Bookstore:** Our staff will offer personalized assistance.



- **Restaurants and bar:** The Bar Guggenheim Bilbao is accessible from the square. The Museum also offers visitors two international culinary experiences of very fine quality: Nerua Guggenheim Bilbao, a restaurant serving haute cuisine, and the Bistró Guggenheim Bilbao, a more informal, accommodating and different proposal for any time of the day or night. Both restaurants are wheelchair accessible and provide service at all tables. If you have any food allergies, please let us know and we will suggest suitable alternatives. The restaurants also have high chairs for children.

- **Auditorium:** Has spaces reserved for wheelchairs and is equipped with an induction loop system.

- At the **Community** desk an adapted area is available for wheelchair users, which is also equipped with an induction loop system. At this desk you can also buy tickets, get to know Community and learn information about the Museum.

## GUIDED SCHOOL TOURS

- All programs are suited for groups that include students with special needs, just let us know prior to your visit so that we may adapt the tour for them. All educational spaces are wheelchair accessible.
